

PROCESSION OF LORD MAYOR—*continued.**Ambulances.*

34. "St. John" ambulances will be stationed at the following points:—

1. St. Clement Dane's Church, East end.
2. Lancaster-place, Wellington-street.
3. Trafalgar-square, top of Northumberland-avenue.
4. Great Scotland-yard.
5. Villiers-street, Victoria Embankment end, under, Charing-cross Railway Bridge.
6. Victoria Embankment, under Waterloo Bridge.

*Officers on Duty and in Charge.*

35. Should the Chief Constables or Superintendents desire to suggest any amendment of this Order, a report of the particulars, and the reasons for the amendment recommended is to be submitted on or before the 8th inst.

36. The Chief Constable, No. 2 District, will be on duty on the route of the procession between the City Boundary (Chancery-lane), and Charing Cross (top of Northumberland-avenue).

37. The Chief Constable, No. 5 District, will be on duty between the top of Northumberland-avenue (Charing Cross) and City Boundary, Victoria Embankment.

38. The Assistant Commissioner (Administrative) will be on duty at Commissioner's Office.

## DOCKYARDS, ETC. (G.O., page 230) MAGAZINE STATIONS.—

Revolvers—  
instructions  
for guidance  
of Police,  
armed with.

325a. Police armed with revolvers, are, when they detect the approach of any person or persons whose actions are suspicious, to challenge such person or persons by calling out "Halt, who goes there?" If the person or persons fail to reply to the challenge or to give a satisfactory explanation and continue to advance, the Constable should, if circumstances permit, repeat the challenge and warn them that unless they stop he will fire, at the same time, if possible, blowing his whistle. If they still advance, and he has reason to infer from their actions or the surrounding circumstances that they are evilly disposed, it will be necessary for him to fire with the object of disabling them.

325b. On hearing the sound of the police whistle, or the discharge of firearms, Police on adjoining beats are to hasten in the direction of the alarm and render assistance. A communication stating the cause of the disturbance and exact locality is to be sent as early as possible to the Officer in charge of the Establishment.

325c. The officer in charge, on receipt of the alarm, will instantly call out all resident Police, and after issuing the available revolvers, direct them to proceed forthwith to the place indicated, where they will act as directed by the officer in charge.

325d. It must be borne in mind that in any such emergency the Superintendent should be informed at the earliest possible opportunity, in order that he may take over the direction of further police action.

325e. The foregoing instructions apply specially to Magazine Stations, but are to be observed in all cases where Police are specially armed for the purpose of protecting property.
